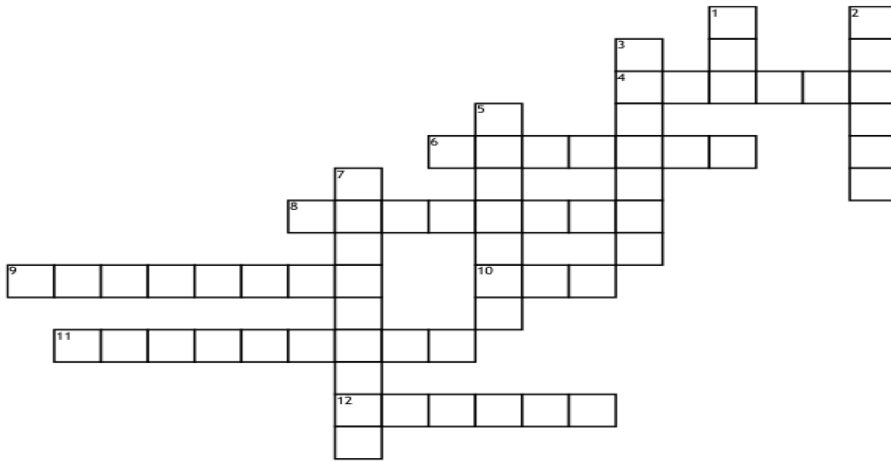
Celebrate Servanthood

Ask your children to tell you about some people they know who follow Jesus. What are some of the things that these people do? Encourage them to think of people they personally know. Visiting people who are sick or driving someone to an appointment might be possible answers. Ask them to think about people in their church, like the choir director or their Sunday school teacher. How do they serve Jesus? Is anyone in a scout troop? Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts pledge to serve God. What have they done to show God's love to others? What are some things they might do to serve God by helping other people? Review the list of all that they have said people do to serve others. Jesus told us to love each other and by doing that, other people will see how special it is to follow Jesus. Close with a prayer: "Dear Jesus, we admit that sometimes it is hard to take the time to help others. Help us to try harder to help and love others. In your name. Amen."
